WHAT IS THE WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM?

Weatherization is the nation's largest residential energy efficiency program.

Weatherization reduces energy costs for low-income Americans by improving the efficiency of their homes

Weatherization specifically focuses on assisting low-income people, primarily the elderly, persons with disabilities, and families with young children

High energy users or households with a high energy burden may also receive priority

High energy costs are an excessive burden on low-income Americans

Weatherization alleviates this burden and improves the standard of living for these individuals and families.

HOW DOES WEATHERIZATION WORK?

Weatherization technicians conduct an energy audit on the single family, multi-family, or mobile home.

Diagnostic equipment is used to identify air infiltration, appliance efficiency, and areas of heat loss.

Weatherization crews install the most cost-effective energy efficient measures, based on the results of the energy audit.

Examples of these measures include, but are not limited to, installing attic and wall insulation, caulking and sealing to reduce air infiltration, weather-strip doors and windows, duct sealing, perform heating and cooling unit tune-ups or replacements, solar screens, installation of LED lighting, low-flow showerheads, programmable thermostats, refrigerator replacement, minor repairs, and alleviate health and safety concerns.

Throughout the process weatherization informs the occupants of the home about the measures being installed, how to maintain the measures, and other ways to further reduce energy use.

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible, households must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Households who receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Veteran's Benefits, or Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) could be eligible.

IS YOUR HOME ELIGIBLE?

Although an applicant may be income eligible for the program, their house may not qualify.

Due to programmatic requirements, homes which are in need of extensive repairs are not eligible and are referred to other programs.

Homes that have been weatherized under this program since September 30, 1994 are not eligible.

HOW DO I APPLY?

SPCAA administers the Weatherization Program in 15 counties:

Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum County

Residents in these counties who believe they are eligible, should call their local neighborhood center to obtain an appointment with an outreach worker.
